

CV of Ramesh Jaura

Ramesh Jaura is a journalist with nearly 40 years of professional experience in Europe and India. He began his career as a reporter, correspondent and current affairs writer after obtaining a Master of Arts (M.A.) degree in English literature from the University of Delhi.

Ramesh Jaura has managed to combine his professional pursuits with creating awareness among wider sections of the public about the global nature of problems and challenges confronting humankind.

He was elected in June 2004 as President of Europe's Forum for International Cooperation (Euforic), based in Maastricht, the Netherlands. Jaura is a co-founder and first Chairman of the GLOBAL COOPERATION COUNCIL (North-South Forum), GCC Forum, the first of its kind in Germany.

Presently, Ramesh Jaura is the Director of IPS EUROPA, a Berlin-based public benefit organization affiliated to independent global news agency IPS-Inter Press Service, which has a soft corner for the developing lands. He is also the web publisher and web editor of the portal to world-wide communication on the Internet, GlobalomNet, and of the monthly e-Journal The Global South @ www, available only on the World Wide Web.

Ramesh Jaura made his mark as a keen observer of German and European politics when he edited and published a book entitled 'The Fettered Giant' ('Der gefesselte Riese') in 1981 with contributions from 30 Germany-based correspondents from 30 countries around the world.

In fact, as the president of the Foreign Correspondents' Association in Germany for three successive years - 1981-1983 - Ramesh Jaura carved out a name for himself not the least because of the very fact that he was the first Third World national to hold the office.

Ramesh Jaura was awarded the Federal Cross on Ribbon (Bundesverdienstkreuz am Bande) for promoting international understanding by the German Federal President Roman Herzog in 1996. The award was handed out at a special and exclusive ceremony by the Lord Mayor of the City of Bonn on June 26, 1996.
